Creating temporary public open space . . . one parking spot at at time.

An annual open-source global event, Nanaimo's 2014 PARK(ing) Day will be held along Commercial Street from 11:00 am until 2:00 pm, as participants transform a select number of parking spaces into temporary, short-term mini parks. Participants include Coastal Community Credit Union, Vancouver Island University, Vancouver Island Regional Library, Mid Island Metis Nation, and the Department of Parks, Recreation & Environment. Everyone is welcome to attend.

- PARK(ing) Day is an annual event where citizens, artists and activists collaborate to transform parking spaces into "PARK(ing)" spaces, or temporary public cultural spaces.
- The PARK(ing) day project began in 2005 when Rebar, a San Francisco art and design studio, converted a single metered parking space into a temporary public park in downtown San Francisco.
- The PARK(ing) day concept is truly a global movement. It happens in over 162 cities in over 35 countries and on 6 continents transforming close to 1000 parking spots into exciting cultural spaces.
