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City to relocate the log boom at Lower Colliery Dam

Summary

In an effort to improve the aesthetics of the Lower Colliery Dam reservoir by preventing the build-up of floating debris, the City of Nanaimo will be relocating a log boom away from the original outlet and towards the newer auxiliary spillway. The steps taken will allow routine floating debris to continue down through the channel as it did historically.

Key Points

- A log boom in the Lower Colliery Dam reservoir is required to protect the spillway from floating debris.
- Relocating the log boom will reduce the buildup of floating debris across the reservoir thereby enhancing the appearance of the park.

- The majority of the dam's spillway capacity is provided by the auxiliary spillway which remains protected behind the log boom after the relocation.
