Nanaimo residents encouraged to attend Events Centre open house meetings

Six open houses will be held in various parts of the city in the upcoming weeks

Summary

Residents of Nanaimo are invited to take part in a series of six open houses being held across the City to discuss the proposed Events Centre.

The purpose of these open houses is to encourage people in the community to get involved in this decision-making process by asking questions and examining the information that has been made available. There will be a number of City staff and Councillors in attendance to answer questions and provide information to the public.

February 23 from 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. at the Harewood Activity Centre

March 1 from 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. at Beban Park Lounge

Also, City staff will be meeting with students in Vancouver Island University's upper cafeteria from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm on February 15.
