City provides residents more information on automated collection program

The City will soon begin a communications program all about Sort Toss Roll

Summary

The City of Nanaimo is about to launch a summer communications program aimed at helping residents get to know all about the upcoming changes to the solid waste collection service.

Beginning July 1, City staff will be setting up informational displays in City facilities, shopping malls throughout the City and at various public events. Included in the communication program is a four month long display at Woodgrove centre and cart "test-drive" displays at City facilities.

The automated collection program, called Sort Toss Roll, will begin in Central Nanaimo in the fall and in the rest of the City in summer 2018.

Strategic Link: Taking responsibility to be an excellent municipal government.

Key Points

- The Sort Toss Roll program offers residents a set of three carts that are easy, clean and safe to use.
- Under Sort Toss Roll, recycling will be much more convenient for residents who will receive a wheeled cart for the placement of recycleables instead of a yellow bag.
- Residents will now be able to include yard waste alongside kitchen waste in the organics bin. Please note this is only available to homes once they have received their new wheeled carts.
- The program will be paid for by garbage user rates. User rates are currently \$102.75 and are expected to rise to \$118.04 in July. A full cost projection for the project is available at Nanaimo.ca/goto/sorttossroll

Quick Facts

- The City of Nanaimo is introducing automated waste collection late this fall to about 8,000 households in central Nanaimo. The rest of the City will receive these services in the summer of 2018.
- Automated collection trucks use automated arms to grasp specially designed carts, lift the carts and empty them into the truck.
- Before service begins, each household in central Nanaimo will receive one set of three colour-coded wheeled carts and a complete information kit.
