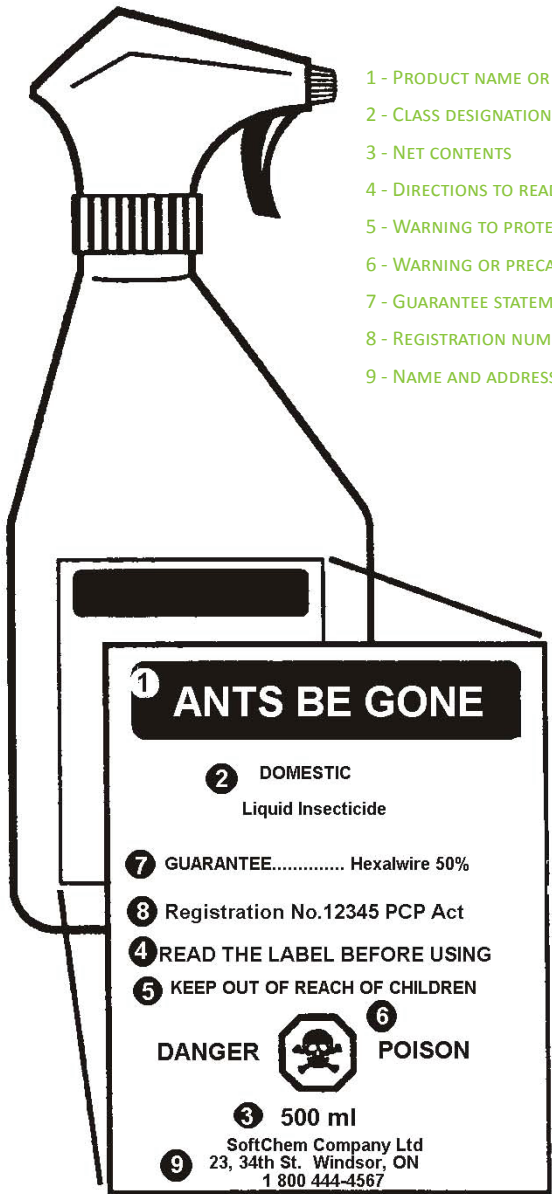


HOW TO READ THE LABEL



- 1 - PRODUCT NAME OR TRADE NAME
- 2 - CLASS DESIGNATION
- 3 - NET CONTENTS
- 4 - DIRECTIONS TO READ THE LABEL
- 5 - WARNING TO PROTECT CHILDREN
- 6 - WARNING OR PRECAUTIONARY SYMBOLS
- 7 - GUARANTEE STATEMENT
- 8 - REGISTRATION NUMBER (PCP NUMBER)
- 9 - NAME AND ADDRESS OF REGISTRANT

GUARANTEE states the common name of the active ingredient(s) in the product. The active ingredient is the part of the pesticide product that controls the pest.

If you choose to use an excluded pesticide, please read the “GUARANTEE” on the label.

Ingredient not on the list?

If the active ingredient(s) in the GUARANTEE is not on the Excluded Pesticide List then it is restricted and cannot be used by the homeowner.

WHICH PESTICIDES ARE PERMITTED?

The bylaw allows the following ingredients from the Excluded Pesticide List to be used for cosmetic, non-essential purposes:

- Acetic acid
- Biological control agents such as Bt (*Bacillus thuringiensis*) and nematodes
- Borax
- Corn gluten meal
- Fatty acids
- Ferric or ferrous phosphates
- Soaps
- Mineral oil (dormant or horticultural oil)
- Pyrethrum or pyrethrins
- Silicon dioxide (diatomaceous earth)
- Sulphur (lime sulphur and other sulphur compounds)

For a complete list of pesticides permitted under the bylaw, see the List of Excluded Pesticides.

SOME OF THE COMMONLY USED PESTICIDES NOT PERMITTED UNDER THE BYLAW:

Guarantee	Common Use
2,4-D	Herbicide in weed and feed type products
Diacamba	Herbicide used in weed control products
Mecoprop (MCPP)	Herbicide used in weed control products
Glyphosate	Herbicide broad spectrum
Malathion	Insecticide
Carbaryl	Insecticide and plant growth regulator

Note: vegetable gardens & fruit trees are exempt from the bylaw
