Enjoy a Safe Halloween Season Without Fireworks

Summary

As Halloween approaches, the City of Nanaimo reminds residents of two important rules that enhance public safety.

The sale, possession and use of fireworks is banned in the City without a valid permit in accordance with Fireworks Regulation Bylaw 2007 No. 7049. In addition, residents are also reminded that bonfires are not allowed unless a special event burning permit is requested in person at 580 Fitzwilliam for Halloween (Oct 31) and Guy Fawkes Day (Nov 5). Both permits must be obtained before noon on those dates. All other burning regulations apply.

The City encourages residents to use caution when undertaking Halloween activities and to ensure any candles or other combustibles are fully extinguished after use.

- A special events burning permit is required for residents wishing to have a bonfire.
