--- MCCOURT RESIDENCE (750 Franklyn Street) ---Owned by Ms. Andrea Saam-Lawry and Mr. Tim Lawry. To be presented with a Heritage Rehabilitation Award (Residential) for exterior rehabilitation work completed in 2014

--- ST. PAUL'S ANGLICAN CHURCH (100 Chapel Street) ---Owned by The Anglican Synod of the Diocese of BC. To be presented with a Heritage Rehabilitation Award (Institutional) for roof upgrade work completed in 2014
