The City of Nanaimo would like to remind pet owners that sheltering or keeping any animal or bird that persistently cries, barks or howls is prohibited. Applicable regulations are in place to ensure residents can benefit from the quiet, peace and enjoyment of their neighbourhood.

- Regulations concerning noisy pets or animals are in place to control noise pollution within the City.
- Concerns surrounding noisy pets or animals are enforced by the City on a complaint basis.
