Artificial turf being replaced in Beban Park

Summary

One of the artificial turf fields in Beban Park is in the process of being replaced. The new turf and shock pad will be installed this month. The goal is have the field ready for play in early September.

The new turf, with the addition of a shock pad, comes with a number of improvements including a natural grass-like look and feel; a better infill which is a spread made of various products that is found between the grass fibres that provides appropriate cushioning to absorb impact and provide traction; and stronger backing which increases the durability of the entire product comprised of woven polypropylene fabrics.

 A shock pad is the underlay of the field essentially providing a cushioning layer that can absorb the impact from a fall. A shock pad improves the comfort and safety of the field. It makes the surface more enjoyable to play on!
