

Nanaimo's PARK(ing) Day returns on Friday, September 18, 2015

Creating temporary public space . . . one parking spot at at time.

Summary

On September 18, 2015 from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm, a select number of spaces along Commercial Street will be transformed for Nanaimo's 2nd annual PARK(ing) Day. PARK(ing) Day is a annual open-source global event where citizens and artists collaborate to temporarily transform parking spaces into "PARK(ing)" spaces: temporary public cultural places. For 2015, the following groups will participate:

- Vancouver Island University
- Vancouver Island Regional Library
- Mid Island Metis Nation
- Nanaimo Aloha Ukelele Circle
- Continual Threshold
- Downtown Nanaimo Business Improvement Association

Everyone is encouraged to check out the transformed spaces along Commercial Street.

- Nanaimo's 2nd annual PARK(ing) Day will be held on Friday, September 18, 2015 along Commercial Street from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm.
- The mission of PARK(ing) Day is to call attention to the need for more urban open cultural space, to generate critical debate around how public space is created and allocated, and to improve the quality of the urban habitat.
- The event raises awareness about important issues like creating a walkable, livable, healthier and more "creative" Nanaimo.
