# Residents reminded of regulations concerning the keeping of chickens and ducks

### **Summary**

Residents raising chickens and ducks are reminded to observe regulations that promote the keeping of urban poultry as either pets or as a sustainable food source in a way that prevents any nuisance to neighbours or people nearby. Key things to remember include:

- Six chickens or ducks may be kept on land that is less than 0.4 hectares (1 acre) in size or; four chickens on a lot that is less than 450m sq (4843.75 ft sq).
- Chickens and ducks may be kept provided there are no roosters, cocks, cockerels or peacocks.
- Structures to house chickens and ducks must comply with required yard setbacks and be kept clean.
- No slaughtering of chickens or ducks is permitted on the property.
- Chickens or ducks cannot be kept within a dwelling unit.
- Diseased chickens or ducks that are destroyed must have the carcass disposed of.
- Any manure and waste from the chickens or ducks must be composted or disposed of.
- Chickens and ducks cannot trespass on public property, private property, unfenced land or released or abandoned in the City.

## **Key Points**
