City to host budget focused "eTown Hall" November 23rd

Residents encouraged to participate

Summary

Nanaimo residents wishing to discuss the City's 2016 budget process can now do so by participating in an upcoming eTown Hall meeting scheduled for November 23rd. The meeting follows the tradition of tabling a topic for discussion between Council members and the public but, unlike conventional town hall meetings, Nanaimo's eTown Hall format enables wider involvement by allowing participants to submit questions via Twitter, Facebook, webform, phone call, as well as in person.

The eTown Hall will commence at 6:00 p.m. during the scheduled Committee of the Whole Meeting. The eTown Hall will run for one hour. If demand is high, an additional 30 minutes will be allocated.

Strategic Link: Taking Responsibility to be an excellent municipal government - exploring opportunities for Town Hall Meetings.

Key Points

- The November 23rd eTown Hall meeting will focus on the City's annual budget. Residents are encouraged to review available budget information prior to the meeting beginning.
- The City's annual budget process is completed over a period of several months. The November 23rd eTown
 Hall meeting is being held near the start of the process to ensure comments and questions from residents are
 identified early.
