The Nanaimo Skating Club will be offering a free skating lesson and then will show off their talent with a demonstration in Frank Crane Arena. After that, watch and cheer on your favourite team while the Midget Tier 1 Nanaimo Clippers take on the Midget Tier 2 Peninsula Eagles in a Rep league game.
