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Conference Centre Hotel project moves forward

Summary

The City of Nanaimo is pleased to announce that on September 17, 2018, PEG Development submitted an updated building permit for their nine-storey Courtyard by Marriot project at 100 Gordon Street. The updated permit has increased the number of guest rooms from 155 rooms to 172 rooms. The project remains consistent with the approved Development Permit.

The City of Nanaimo will continue to review the Building Permit and anticipate it will be issued by the end of October 2018.

Key Points

- In September 2018, PEG submitted a revised Building Permit for a 172 room, nine-storey facility.
- The project remains consistent with the approved Development Permit.

Quick Facts

- Under the Purchase Agreement, the City has the option to repurchase the property if PEG has not spent \$1,000,000 on physical improvements to the property by December 2019.
- In June 2017, PEG Development was selected by Council to develop the Conference Centre Hotel project at 100 Gordon Street. The original proposal called for a 112 room, six-storey Courtyard by Marriot. In November 2017, a Development Permit for the property was approved which increased the size of the hotel to a 155 room, nine-storey facility.
- In April 2018, a Building Permit was submitted consistent with the Development Permit.
