Open house planned for proposed home-based business regulations

Summary

The City of Nanaimo is reviewing and updating its home-based business regulations and will be hosting a public open house on Tuesday, December 4 from 4-7 pm in the Vancouver Island Conference Centre's Shaw Lobby.

The regulations were first introduced in 1993 and much has changed over the last twenty five years, including type of business activities and the trend towards higher density developments. The update considers permitted uses, size of business, number of employees, vehicle trips and more.

Home-based businesses are those that are either operated at home or from home, where either most of the business is conducted on the operator's property or the home is used as a base of operations for work done outside of the property.
