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Public Engagement Pilot Program wraps up

Final report presented to Council

Summary

The Public Engagement Pilot Program wrapped up after members of the Community Engagement Task Force presented their report with recommendations to Council at the Regular Committee of the Whole meeting on Monday, January 28, 2019. Council will take the recommendations under advisement and will consider them during the development of their strategic plan, committees formation and other initiatives.

The Public Engagement Pilot Program consisted of four engagement sessions held over the course of one year and began in November 2017. The purpose of the program was to "further community engagement and public conversation" in a less formal setting than a Council or Committee of the Whole meeting.
