Nesting Boxes Installed at Oliver Woods Park

Parks & Recreation and Nature Kids Collaborate

Summary

This spring, the wood ducks at Oliver Woods will have a new nesting option with the installation of four wooden duck boxes.

This installation is in partnership with the Nanaimo NatureKids and will be installed the first week of April. Wooden duck boxes are designed to provide a safe nesting area where natural cavities are limited.

This is not the first program Parks and Recreation and the Nanaimo NatureKids have tackled. Last year several maternity bat boxes were installed at Diver Lake and Linley Point Gyro Park to give bats a safe place to roost, raise babies and cover from the elements. Bats play an important role in the environment, especially controlling insect populations.
