For example, did you know that Westwood Lake used to be a dairy farm and that remnants of that farm still sit at the bottom of the lake? Did you know that Pawson Park is one of the oldest established parks in the City and was named after Major John Pawson?

NORTH END PARKS: Brookwood Park, Carmanah Park, Cottle Creek Park, Daynes Park, Groveland Park, Kenwill Park, Linley Point Gyro Park, Roxanne Park, Westdale/Leslie Park, Westhaven Park
