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Increased cardboard creating curbside collection service disruptions

Residents asked to ensure cardboard is flattened and meets size requirements

Summary

The City of Nanaimo's curbside collection service is experiencing delays, resulting in late evening or next-day pickups. The delays are mainly due to higher volumes of waste being set out, compounded by mechanical issues. The COVID-19 pandemic has shifted residential waste and disposal habits with online orders (and subsequent disposal) surging.

Sanitation drivers are seeing increased volumes of recycling - especially very large quantities of cardboard boxes being discarded. Much of the cardboard in the blue carts does not meet size guidelines (no larger than two feet in any dimension). Unflattened or oversized cardboard overloads the trucks' compactors and decreases the number of carts that can be collected before diverting to the depot to empty. Overloading results in more frequent trips to and from the City's recycling facility, more operating time, vehicle maintenance and increases pollution and the cost to deliver the user-funded curbside collection service.

Key Points

- Blue carts containing oversize cardboard larger than two feet in any dimension may not be collected.
- Ensure cardboard in your blue cart is flattened and does not exceed two feet in any dimension.
- Use the free Nanaimo Recycles app to be notified in the case delays affect your collection route.
