# Celebrate World Rivers Day in Nanaimo virtually

# **Summary**

The fourth Sunday of September is Rivers Day, a day to celebrate the world's waterways and their importance to all life on earth. This year the event is 40 years old. The City of Nanaimo and several community partners, including the Regional District of Nanaimo - Team WaterSmart, Nanaimo & Area Land Trust (NALT), Nanaimo Science, Snuneymuxw First Nation, Nanaimo Port Authority, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, Fishing for Fun and Steek Snorkel, are collaborating to bring a wide array of online events that are happening this week and leading up to the virtual celebration of the official Rivers Day on Sunday, September 27.

Activities for Rivers Day are created around specific themes, including Explore and Observe, Recreate, Connect, Restore, Learn, Respect and Celebrate.
