Emergency kits. ShakeOut. Call alerts. It's Emergency Preparedness Month

Summary

From earthquakes to storms and potential floods, the City of Nanaimo wants everyone to be prepared. To help raise awareness, the City is sharing messages throughout October to help residents and businesses with emergency preparation.

Where and when a disaster may hit isn't predictable, but there are steps we can take to be ready. These include preparing an emergency kit and stocking enough food and water to last you and your family for a week, developing an escape plan with a muster point outside of your home and workplace, signing up for the City's Voyent Alert! emergency alert system and knowing how to react in an emergency such as an earthquake (drop, cover and hold on).

There are a few emergency related events this month as well, including the Great BC ShakeOut on October 15, 2020. Visit www.shakeoutbc.ca for details. During the pandemic, we encourage businesses and residents to ensure all COVID-19 Health and Safety protocols are followed as part of the Great BC ShakeOut drill.

The City of Nanaimo will be sending out an emergency alert test on October 27 through the Voyent Alert! system. If you haven't signed up for an alert yet, go to www.nanaimo.ca/goto/alerts

This can be done by reviewing your earthquake plans, refreshing your emergency kits or a virtual office meeting. The Great BC ShakeOut drill will be aired on 102.3 the Wave and 106.9 the Wolf.
