City of Nanaimo Vaccination Mandate

Nanaimo, BC – As of January 10, 2022, the City of Nanaimo will require all City employees and City contracted employees (i.e., contract instructors) to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 in order to protect the health and safety of municipal employees and the community.

Employees who fail to provide proof of vaccination will be given a further opportunity to do so from January 10 to February 6, 2022. During this period, employees will be able to continue to work so long as they participate in the City's Rapid Testing Program. The City will cover the costs of the rapid testing for employees until February 6, 2022.

Beginning February 7, 2022 employees without proof of vaccination will be required to continue to participate in the City's Rapid Testing program and are responsible for associated costs (i.e. the cost of rapid testing kits, costs of testing personnel, external testing services). Test results will be considered valid for 72 hours from the time the test is completed.

Employees who have not provided proof of vaccination or do not participate in the City's Rapid Testing Program will be placed on an immediate unpaid leave of absence. Employees will be permitted to return to work if they provide proof of vaccination or participate in the City's Rapid Testing program.
