City of Nanaimo announces new Youth Poet Laureate, Paige Pierce

Summary

The City of Nanaimo is pleased to announce Paige Pierce, a talented young writer and poet, has been appointed as Nanaimo's newest Youth Poet Laureate. In this role, she will serve as a "young people's poet", raising awareness of poetry and the positive impact the literary arts can have on community life.

Paige was appointed to the position of Youth Poet Laureate for her ability to engage and inspire community, as well as her innovative ideas regarding her vision for the position, and the future engagement of Nanaimo's young literary community. As she steps into the role, Paige hopes to develop a community of aspiring and practicing poets, providing opportunities to draft, refine, and share their work. She also plans to host readings and poetry cafe events to showcase the voices of young writers in Nanaimo.

"I stir the macaroni

holding back a sob

or maybe just a stomach ache

that I haven't managed to cure

mom and I FaceTime every night

we categorize our mourning into

'wimpy days'

as if our heartache was prescribed by a mood swing

or the agonies of womanhood

and not the shadow of your essence

that we keep hoping to see

peaking around sullen corners"

In this excerpt from Paige Pierce's poem, "Nan's Pasta Recipe" (2024), she articulates the challenges and anxieties of many adolescents as they transition from childhood to adulthood, accompanied by reflections on family, love and grief.

The City's Youth Poet Laureate program is a connection to Nanaimo's youth, inspiring strong youth voices within our community. Mentored by the Poet Laureate, the Youth Poet Laureate will present original work to City Council and the community through a variety of civic events. They will also be responsible for organizing community-based youth poetry projects, including collaboration with local organizations such as the Nanaimo Harbourfront Library and Literacy Central Vancouver Island. Reaching a variety of audiences and encouraging peer to peer education and inspiration, the Youth Poet Laureate paves the way for future youth to engage on a civic level using their artistic voice. The Youth Poet Laureate is an advocate for poetry, language and the arts.
