OVERVIEW

Purpose of Report

To present Council with an application for the existing liquor manufacturing licence for Arbutus Distillery to permit a licensed outdoor patio.

Recommendation

That Council recommend the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch approve an application for a structural change to a liquor manufacturing licence in order to permit a licensed outdoor patio area.

BACKGROUND

The City has received correspondence from Mr. Mike Pizzitelli (Arbutus Distillery). The distillery currently has a manufacturers lounge endorsement, which permits an onsite lounge with a person capacity of 30. The applicant is requesting a local government resolution in support of his application to the provincial Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) for a structural change to the manufacturing licence in order to permit liquor service on an existing 27.87m² (300ft²) covered patio at the distillery building. The permitted hours of service for the lounge are 11am to 11pm seven days a week.

On 2016-JUN-20, Council endorsed an application for a lounge endorsement within the building. As part of the lounge endorsement application, a public hearing was held and comment sheets were delivered to property owners, residents and business owners within 100m of the subject property. No submissions were received at the public hearing and no negative responses were received from the comment sheets. An amendment application is now required for the patio endorsement.

DISCUSSION

As part of the liquor manufacturing licence amendment review process, LCLB asks the local government to comment on potential for noise, impact on the community and views of residents/neighbouring businesses. The local government is also asked to offer comment from a building and fire perspective.

• The potential for noise if the application is approved

The subject property is located within a light industrial park and the lounge is permitted as an ancillary use to the distillery operation. The closest residential property is over 150m from the subject property. The RCMP and applicant note no noise complaints have been received since the lounge began operations in the fall of 2016. The applicant does plan



to continue to provide live acoustic music within the building, but it will not be amplified. Given the subject property location, limited capacity and hours of the lounge, and the applicant's current record of no noise complaints, Staff anticipates that the outdoor patio will not result in any noise concerns.

• The impact on the community if the application is approved

Arbutus Distillery is a small 'craft distillery' and, as such, is required by the LCLB to use entirely raw BC agriculture inputs for the production of its spirits. The distillery is the only such craft distillery in the city of Nanaimo and represents a unique venue for locals and tourists. The patio endorsement application represents an expansion of a successful small business and an opportunity for patrons to enjoy locally produced cocktails in an outdoor setting. The addition of the patio will not increase the overall occupant load of the building. The RCMP note 'it is not anticipated that the proposed application would have any impact on criminal activity, public disorder, noise or police resources'. The applicant's letter of rationale is included as Attachment B and the RCMP referral response is included as Attachment C. A negative community impact is not anticipated.

• The views of residents / neighbouring businesses

A public notice and comment sheet has been mailed and hand delivered to the owners, residents, and business owners of buildings and properties within 100m of the subject property. A total of 34 comment sheets were mailed out and delivered. Of the six responses received, six are in support of the application and none are opposed. Comment sheets returned are included as Attachment D.

Opt Out of Application Process

With respect to all liquor licence applications, it is worth noting that Council has the option to provide no comment. If Council chooses to opt out of the application process, Staff will inform the LCLB of Council's decision and no further action will be taken by Staff regarding the application. If a local government chooses to opt out, the LCLB will start their own review process, which could considerably delay the application process. As such, Staff recommends that Council does not opt out of the application review process.

Next Steps

Should Council pass a resolution to support the application for a structural change to an existing licensed distillery, Staff will forward the resolution to the LCLB. The final decision regarding the approval of this liquor manufacturing licence amendment application will be made by the LCLB.

SUMMARY POINTS

- An application was received to permit liquor service within an existing outdoor patio area of the Arbutus Distillery located at 1890 Boxwood Road.
- Comment sheets were mailed and delivered to property owners, businesses and residents within 100m of the subject property. Six responses were received with all six in support of the application.
- It is not anticipated that the proposed application would have any impact on criminal activity, public disorder, noise or police resources.



We are in receipt of your memorandum advising that Mr Mike Pizzitelli of Arbutus Distillery intends to make application to the Provincial Liquor Control and Licensing Branch for a structural change to the Manufactoring Licence in order to permit liquor service on a 300 ft² patio. He is seeking a local government resolution in support of his application.

The RCMP has had minimal calls for service to the Arbutus Distillery in recent years. 
Letter of Rationale

Arbutus Distillery - Patio extension

Background.

Arbutus Distillery is classified under the BC Liquor Board as a 'Craft Distillery', where the facility must use entirely BC raw agricultural inputs for the production of its spirits. Under recent amendments initiated in 2013 updating the BC provincial Liquor Control and Licensing act, distilleries meeting the 'craft' requirement are permitted to hold 'Lounge Endorsements' in a similar manner granted to all BC wineries several decades ago. A lounge endorsement, essentially allows the distillery to serve beverages/cocktails made from its manufactured spirits within its already licensed sampling area.

Arbutus Distillery obtained licensing and opened it's lounge in the fall of 2016 and is currently seeking to amend it's current lounge license to include a patio area. The proposed licensed patio area is to be situated within a pre-existing covered patio area at the distillery building entrance.

Nature of Proposed Patio.

The intent of Arbutus Distillery's proposed patio is to enhance the nature of our current tasting lounge, where customers will be permitted to enjoy their drinks outside during warmer weather. The patio area is covered from rain, faces west and gets good sun exposure during late afternoon/early evening (when the lounge typically opens). It is also already properly enclosed with metal gating. With the addition of proper furniture and décor we feel this will be an ideal area for it's intended use. There would be no new construction or alteration the building as the patio space is already a feature of the building. (see photos)





Patron Capacity and Hours of Liquor Service.

Our current occupant load is 30 persons with the lounge operating from primarily from 11am-11pm Thursday through Saturday (although our current license allows us to be open everyday 11am -11pm). The occupant load for the proposed patio addition would not increase our total capacity above 30 persons and is to be determined by the City of Nanaimo.

Intended Demographic

Our intended demographic includes Nanaimo locals with interest in the culinary arts as well as tourists.

Responsible Service & Mitigation of Negative Effects

Under its current licenses Arbutus Distillery already implements the Liquor Board's requirements for the responsible service of alcoholic beverages. All our staff have undergone the required 'Serving it Right' certifications, not only for our own tasting room/lounge but as we routinely participate in several festivals and events throughout the province on a regular basis. We currently implement various policies to ensure responsible consumption such as providing non-alcoholic beverage options and encouragement of designated drivers and promoting various local services such as 'Get-a-go-go'.

Impact of Noise on the Surrounding Community

Given the small size, nature and location of the Arbutus Distillery lounge we do not generate excessive noise. We have a low occupant load as well as any live music is acoustic in nature without amplification. Adjacent neighbours to our property are businesses that generally close around 5pm before peak hours expected from the lounge. Since our addition of the lounge itself we have had zero complaints and we feel the addition of a patio would not change this. In fact, many of out patrons work and/or live nearby and have frequently requested we license our patio space for the summer months.

Benefits to the Community

There are currently no licensed establishments, beyond a food-primary setting, in the immediate area as it has been a relatively new developed region of the city. In addition to providing a safe and close setting for nearby residing patrons, the unique aspect of the service we provide in the form of a small lounge that focuses on high end cocktails does not exist anywhere else in Nanaimo presently. A patio extension would further our efforts in this regard.
