Port Drive Waterfront Master Plan - Summary of Public Engagement Comments

On 21-JUN-2017, the City hosted an Open House to gather public feedback on options for the Port Drive Waterfront Master Plan. Those who attended could leave comments using 'sticky notes' on the Open House boards, or by filling out a survey. There was also an online survey available on the City's website for three weeks. The topics listed below are the primary themes that emerged from these public engagement activities. In addition to this summary, all of the survey comments have been posted on the City's website.

Q 1. The proposed access network for the Port Drive waterfront includes a number of new cycling, pedestrian and vehicle access routes into the site, including a roundabout on Front Street and an extension of the waterfront walkway. Do you have any comments on the proposed access network?
