

## City of Nanaimo Arena FAQ's

Q. Are you here to assist your child with their equipment?

A. If yes, vaccine check required.

Q. Who is responsible for checking POV for City of Nanaimo programs?

A. Guest services contractor and City staff.

Q. Who is responsible for checking arena user groups (Nanaimo Minor Hockey, Clippers, Buccaneers, VIU, Nanaimo Skating Club, Adult Hockey Leagues etc.)?

A. The arena user group is required to check POV for their programs, events, practices and games.

Q. Are you here to watch or spectate an activity (practice, program, skating lesson, public skating, game, competition, tournament, etc.)?

A. If yes, vaccination check is required regardless of the number of people in the facility.

Q. Are spectators required to show POV to watch, practices, programs, skating lessons, public skating, events, games, competition, and tournaments?

A. Yes, POV **is required** for people 12 years + regardless of the number of people attending.

Q. Will these rules change?

A. Yes, that is possible as we are seeking clarification in some areas regarding the vaccine requirements.

Q. Do leaders, coaches, volunteers, safety reps, need to be screened?

A. Yes, people in volunteer capacities require POV. Staff, workers, employees, contractors, in paid positions engaged in work activities are **exempt** from POV.

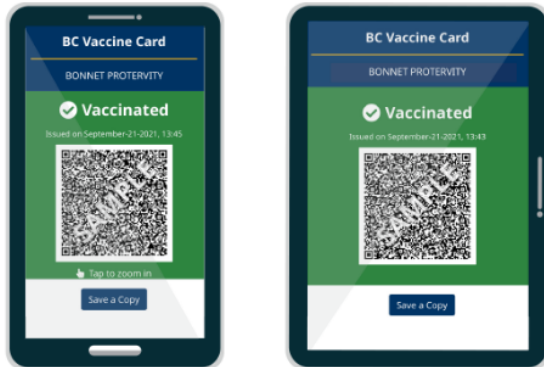

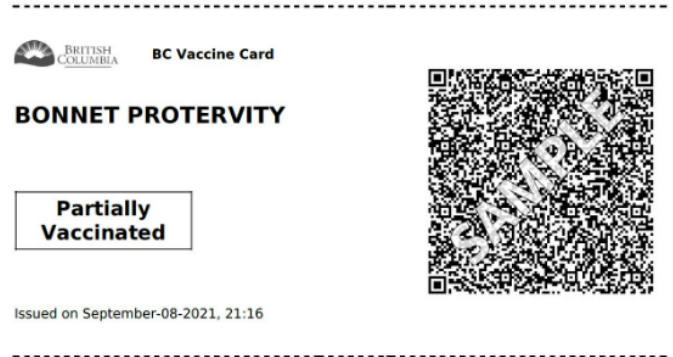
## What the BC Vaccine Card looks like

You can save the digital version to your phone or tablet or print a paper copy to carry in your wallet. Both options are accepted everywhere.

## What your vaccine card shows

### Partially vaccinated



- One dose of vaccine
- Doesn't meet the proof requirement

### Fully vaccinated



- Two doses of vaccine
- Your [booster dose](#) won't affect your card

### No record found



- We don't have a record of your vaccination

## Checking ID

Events, businesses and services will ask to see your BC Vaccine Card **and** a piece of valid government photo ID, for example:

- B.C. driver's licence or BC Services Card
  - You can use your interim driver's licence, usually printed on yellow paper
- Passport
- Photo ID issued by another province or territory

If the name on your B.C. driver's licence or BC Services Card does not reflect your current name, you should [update your ID](#). For example, your current name may be different if you've recently been married, divorced or legally changed your name.

# Out of Province or Out of Country Visitors

## People who don't have B.C. ID

People who don't have a B.C. ID are also required to show proof of vaccination. You might not have B.C. identification if:

- You're visiting from another place
- You just moved here

## People from other provinces or territories

People from other Canadian provinces or territories must show:

- Provincially/territorially officially recognized vaccine record
- Valid government photo ID

## International visitors

International visitors must show:

- Proof of vaccination they used to enter Canada
- Passport

## Canadian and US Armed Forces

Members of the Canadian and US Armed Forces don't need to get a BC Vaccine Card.

Canadian Armed Forces can use their [National Defence Canada COVID-19 vaccine record or card](#) and [National Defence ID card](#).

Visiting US Armed Forces can use their US Military proof of vaccination and US Military ID card.
