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Phase 2 = 2,220 Participants!

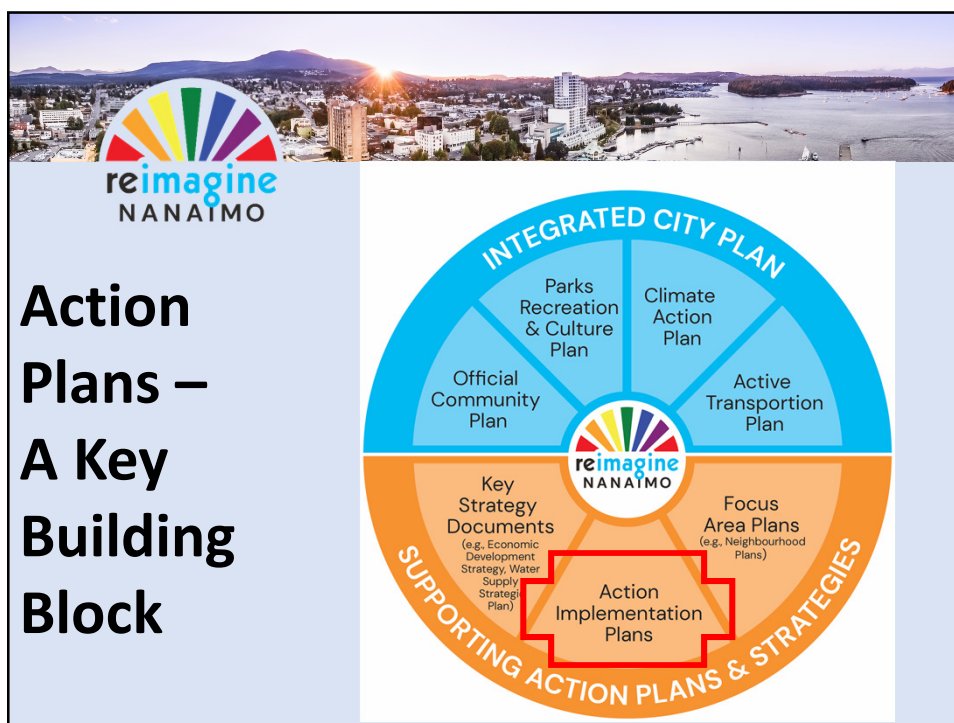
Foundations

- Online Foundations Feedback Form = 476 participants
- Foundations Self-Guided Workshop = 4 participants

Scenarios

- Online Scenarios Survey = 1537 participants
- Scenarios Self-Guided Workbook = 7 participants
- General Public Scenarios Workshops = 94 participants
- Representative Group Workshops = 20 participants
- Other workshops (VIU, Development Community, etc.) = 82 participants







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Topic: Thriving Waterfront

 **Goal:** An Empowered Nanaimo


 **City Plan Policy:** Create and maintain public access to Nanaimo's waterfront, and encourage its use (Existing OCP policy #4.2.17)





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 **Action Plan Project Examples:**

- Continue to work with BC Parks and Snuneymuxw First Nation to provide physical access and interpretive information to Saysutshun via Sway-a-Lana/Maffeo Sutton Park and the waterfront walkway.
- Secure a legal trail right-of-way to Joan Point Park.


 **Target:** Increase the length of waterfront with public access and the number of publicly accessible waterfront features (note: TBD if there will be a more specific target).

Goal: A Green Nanaimo

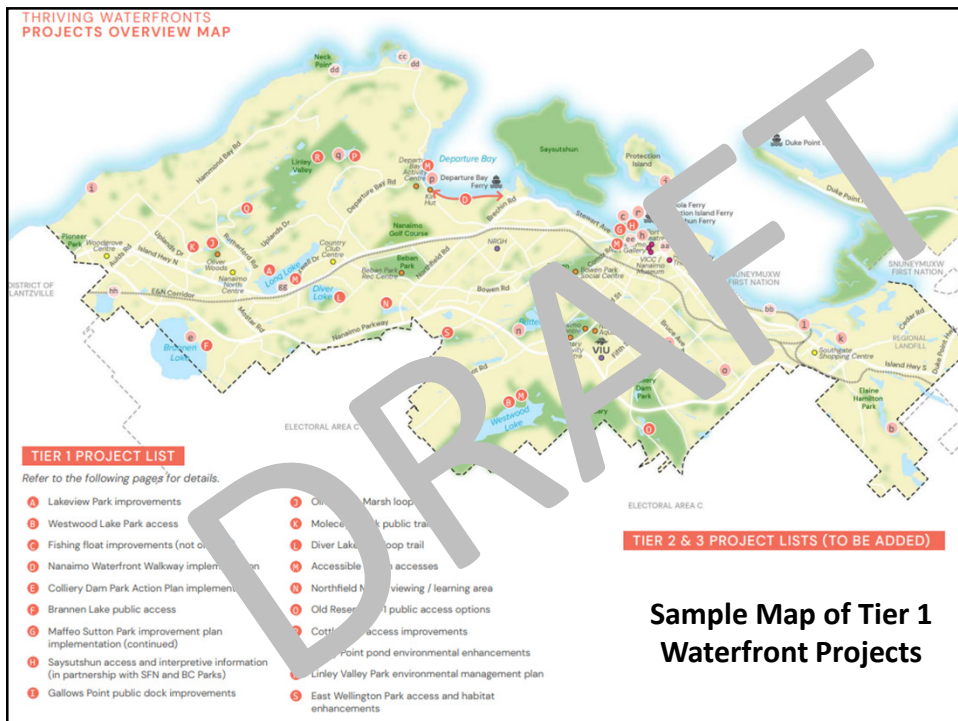


City Plan Policy: Improve the City's agility in responding and recovering from climate-related hazard events



Action Plan Project Examples:

- Incorporate climate change resilience into the review and development of asset management plans
- Ensure contingency reserves that contain an allowance for recovery from climate-related events

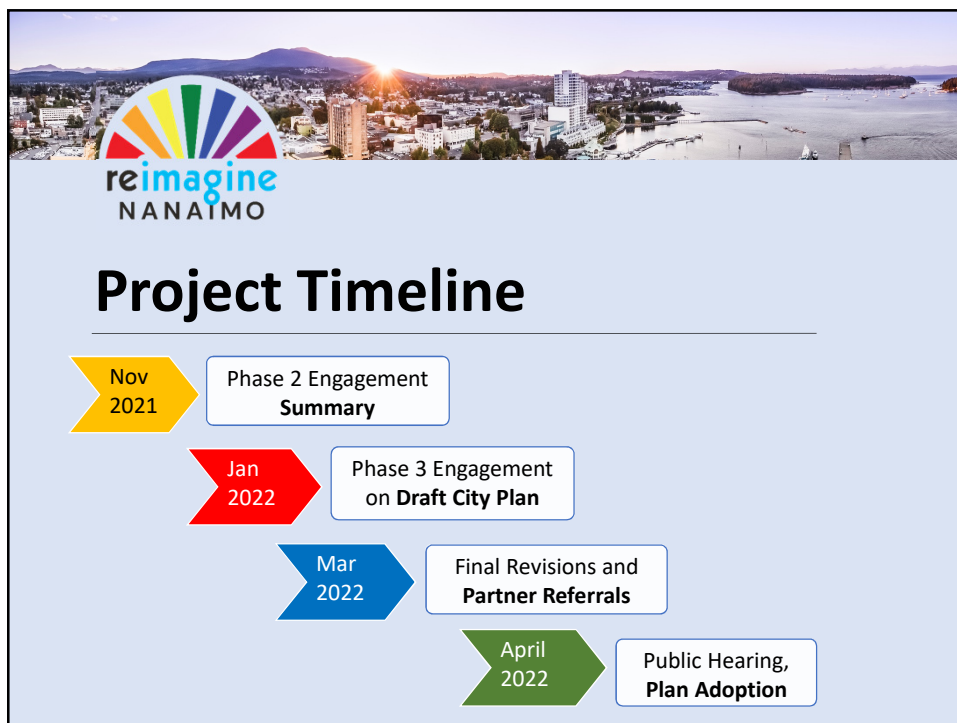


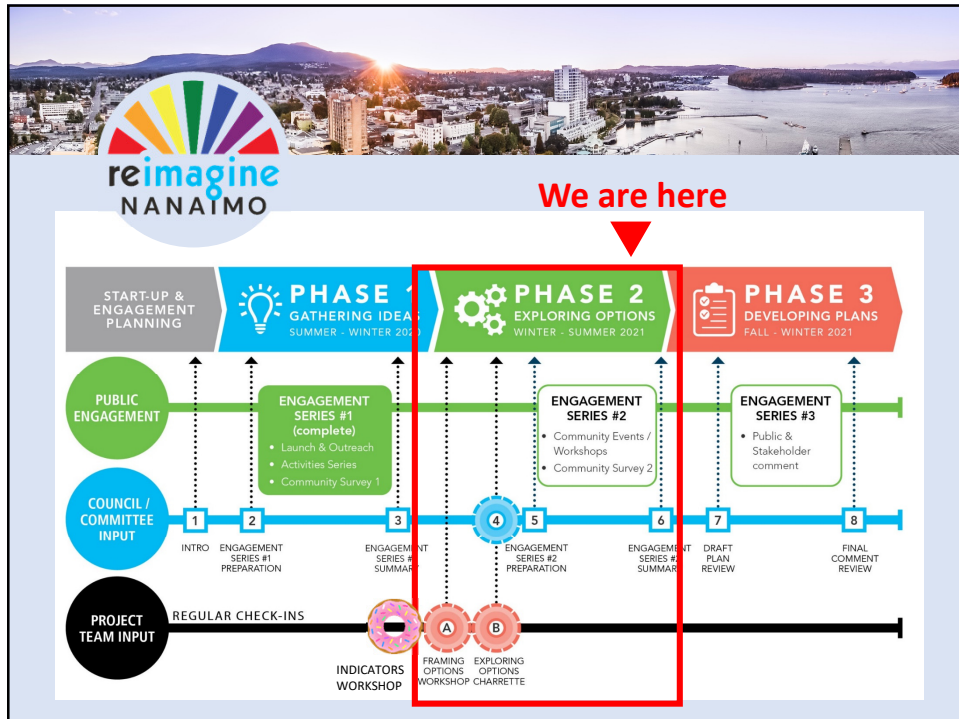




Next Steps
