LINLEY VALLEY PARK BIO-BLITZ A GREAT SUCCESS!

Working with a number of local naturalists, including faculty from VIU, City Parks staff helped host a Bio-Blitz event in Linley Valley Park on May 30th.

The intent of this event was to help raise awareness of the key ecological features of the park and to help promote a sense of stewardship among the high school students attending. Up to 44 students, along with their instructors attended from 4 school eco-clubs.



The students were divided into groups that worked with a team leader on:

- -Terrestrial Wildlife Inventory Techniques -Plant Identification
- -Wetland Inventory Techniques -Bird Identification

At the end of the day, the data collected was posted along with other information about the Park for the public to view, providing an opportunity to collect the public's thoughts and observations on possible improvements for this park.






WESTERN PAINTED TURTLE RESTORATION IN BUTTTUBS MARSH THIS SPRING

This spring, Parks staff were busy working with the Nature Trust of British Columbia (NTBC) and our volunteers to help improve the habitat for the endangered Western Painted Turtle in Buttertubs Marsh by place a number of basking logs around the marsh shoreline. These logs are important habitat features for these turtles. Later, in May, Parks Trails crew realigned an existing

section of trail in order to create a turtle nest beach, a south facing sites to lay their eggs.

DID YOU KNOW? The Painted Turtle is the only native pond turtle left in B.C. It can be confused with the introduced <u>Red-Eared Slider</u>. To tell the two species apart, look for the telltale red "ear"
