

**Calling all youth poets!** The City of Nanaimo's Youth Poet Laureate, Paige Pierce, is hosting a Youth Poetry Competition. Submit a poem of any style, length, or topic for a chance to win prizes! Poems must be appropriate for school-aged audiences.

## Applicants must include in their submission the following documentation:

- One (or more) poem(s) appropriate for school-aged audiences.
- A completed submission form with contact information.

### **Eligibility:**

In order to be eligible as Nanaimo's Youth Poetry Contest, candidates must be **under the age of 18** (youth) and reside within the City of Nanaimo Region.

### Selection process:

All poems will be read and selected by the City of Nanaimo's current Youth Poet Laureate, Paige Pierce. Paige will be looking for the following criteria in submitted works:

- 1. Creativity. Don't be afraid to get creative and be unique! Poetry is abstract and Paige is hoping to see a range of styles and topics submitted through this project.
- 2. Grammar and writing conventions. Does your poem include proper spelling and grammar? Your poem can have whatever structure, rhyme scheme, or layout you feel best suits the piece, but it has to be readable!
- 3. Basic information. Please include your first name (last name optional), age, and either an email address or phone number we can contact you at. If families are submitting on behalf of children, please include the first name of a guardian and their contact information. Don't forget to add a title to your poem!
