Community Wide Partnership To Support Tribal Journeys 2020 in Nanaimo

Snuneymuxw First Nation submitted an expression of interest over a year ago and are the successful hosts for Tribal Journeys scheduled to take place on July 27 to August 1, 2020. Themed "Honouring the Salmon; Honouring Our Ancestors," visitors from around the world will arrive to Nanaimo in traditional canoes at the shores of Snuneymuxw to celebrate Indigenous culture and continue a way of life that has occurred for many generations. The annual event was held in the Lummi Nation this past summer.

Tribal Journeys involve paddlers departing the shores of their home community every year on a traditional cance traveling the Salish Sea stopping at the shores of many First Nations and Native American Tribes for an overnight stay. Cance families continue paddling to the host community where they will engage in a landing ceremony at the shores of Snuneymuxw where each cance will share their Indigenous ceremony as they arrive. Once welcomed, cance families and visitors will proceed to the Snuneymuxw longhouse for protocol ceremony lasting over five days. Nanaimo is set to welcome more than 100 cances, hundreds of paddlers and their road crews, and thousands of other visitors to experience the bounty the city has to offer. Everyone is welcome to attend and witness the six days of Indigenous ceremony and celebration!

It is the first time in 30 years for Snuneymuxw to host Tribal Journeys. The City of Nanaimo, the Regional District of Nanaimo, Vancouver Island University, School District 68, the Nanaimo Port Authority, Tourism Vancouver Island, the Nanaimo Hospitality Association, the Nanaimo Aboriginal Centre and Kw'umut Lelum are proud to partner with Snuneymuxw First Nation to make this historic occasion a success.
