## Re: Water Act Appeal - City of Nanaimo v. April 29, 2015 Order of the Comptroller of Water Rights regarding CWL C061424 & C061423 Colliery Dams

As you know, the Mayor of the City of Nanaimo sent correspondence to the Comptroller of Water Rights advising of a motion passed earlier this week by the City Council in respect of the Colliery Dams (the "Motion"). The Motion proposes an alternative course of action to that required in the Comptroller's Amended Order of April 29, 2015 (the "Order"). As the City's stay application in respect of the Order is currently before the Environmental Appeal Board, I have been instructed to respond on behalf of the Comptroller.

The Comptroller remains committed to the terms of the Order, in particular the actions required of the City to address the potential safety hazards associated with Lower Dam and the timelines stipulated therein. The alternative plan as proposed by the Motion to delay the selection of a remediation approach and the actual remediation work for Lower Dam does not meet the scope or intention of the Order.

While the Motion does not present a proposal that is acceptable as an alternative to the Order, the Comptroller is nevertheless pleased that the City is pursuing a remediation approach for Middle Dam. To be clear, there is nothing preventing the City from submitting a plan for Middle Dam in accordance with paragraph 2(a) of the Order sooner than the deadline, which is the end of 2015. However, the priority in terms of addressing the potential safety hazards is to select, submit and proceed with a

The Comptroller remains open to having without prejudice discussions with legal counsel present.
