RE: LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION NO. LA90 - PERMANENT CHANGE TO A LIQUOR

LICENSE - ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION MOUNT BENSON BRANCH 256

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

That Council recommend the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) approve the application for a structural change to an existing licensed establishment at 1630 East Wellington Road.

PURPOSE:

The City has received a copy of an application to the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) from Mr. Darwyn Henry, on behalf of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 256 for a structural change to an existing licensed establishment at 1630 East Wellington Road (Attachment A). Mr. Henry is applying for an outdoor licensed patio.

As Council is aware, a municipal resolution is required before the province will consider the application further.

BACKGROUND:

Royal Canadian Legion Branch 256 has applied to the LCLB for permission to license a proposed outdoor patio area. The proposed patio area will have an occupancy of approximately 50 people. The patio will be located to the rear of the building on the eastern side, 8.84m from the property line shared with the two-storey, mixed use office and residential building to the east (Attachment B). As the patio will be located behind the building it will not be visible from Quarterway Elementary school, located on the opposite side of East Wellington Road. The applicants have advised that the patio will be closed at 10pm each evening.

DISCUSSION:

Prior to making a recommendation to support or deny an application, the LCLB asks the local government to consider the following:

1. The potential for noise if the application is approved: The proposed patio location will be located less than 10m from the property line shared with the mixed use office/residential building located at 1629 Townsite Road. A twenty-seven unit residential strata building (1620 Townsite Road) is also located behind the legion on the opposite side of Townsite Road.

As such, when considering the application Council is asked to consider what impact increased noised from a licensed patio will have on these and other nearby residents. Given that the applicants have advised that the patio area will be closed at 10pm and that the occupant load for the patio is limited to 50 persons, Staff believes any increased noise concerns resulting from the proposed patio will be minimal.

2. The impact on the community if the application is approved: Like all legions, Branch 256 Legion is a non-profit society, staffed by volunteers to provide a social and supportive atmosphere for veterans and their families. Branch 256 has also contributed positively to the community through donations to the local hospital and student bursaries, as outlined in the applicants letter (Attachment C). By constructing a licensed patio the applicants hope to provide an outdoor space for existing members and make the legion more attractive to encourage membership growth.

The legion is located immediately across from Quarterway Elementary school. Given that the proposed patio will be located behind the building and not visible from the school, Staff does not believe the proposed licensed patio will have a negative effect on the school. A public comment sheet was delivered to the school office and mailed to the School District office.

The RCMP are not opposed the application providing the legion is cognizant of the potential for noise emanating from their business and disturbing the residential neighborhood. A copy of the RCMP letter is attached (Attachment D).

3. The views of the residents: A public notice and comment sheet was mailed to all owners and occupants of the buildings and properties within 100m of the subject property. A total of 65 comment sheets were mailed and delivered. Of the 9 responses received, 6 are in support of the application and 3 are opposed. One of those opposed did not include a name or address on their returned comment sheet. Copies of responses received are attached (Attachment E).

Opt Out of Application Process

With respect to all food and liquor primary license applications, it is worth noting that Council has the option to provide no comment. If Council chooses to opt out of the application process, Staff will inform the LCLB of Council's decision and no further action will be taken by Staff regarding the application. If a local government chooses to opt out, the LCLB will start their own review process, which could considerably delay the application process. As such, Staff does not recommend Council opt out of the decision making process regarding this application.

Next Steps

Following Council's decision regarding the application, Staff will notify the LCLB of Council recommendation. The LCLB will then rely on the Council recommendation when determining whether or not to grant the liquor license amendment request.




LA90- Royal Canadian Legion Branch 256

The Nanaimo RCMP Detachment has received a request to comment on an application by Branch 256 Legion for a structural change to their liquor primary licence with an addition of a licensed patio area. The licensed patio area will have a capacity of 25 -30 persons and will not operate past 10 pm.

A check of data bases indicates that there have not been any calls for service to Branch 256 Legion that are of a concerning nature. Any calls for service are of a typical nature to a liquor establishment.

The proposal of not operating the patio area past 10 pm should have little impact on police resources.

The Nanaimo RCMP are not opposed to Branch 256 Legion being granted structural change to their liquor primary licence providing that they are cognizant of the potential for noise emanating from the business and disturbing the residential neighborhood. Should this occur Branch 256 Legion should be prepared to take measures to rectify this situation.
