SUBJECT LIQUOR LICENCE APPLICATION NO. LA126 – 620 TERMINAL

OVERVIEW

Purpose of Report

To present Council with an application for the existing liquor primary licence for Casino Nanaimo to extend its hours of liquor service at 620 Terminal Avenue.

Recommendation

That Council recommend the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch approve an application to extend the hours of liquor service for the existing liquor primary licence for the property located at 620 Terminal Ave from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m. (Friday and Saturday) to 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 a.m., seven days a week.

BACKGROUND

The City has received correspondence from the Great Canadian Gaming Corporation (Ms. Andrea Nicolls). The applicant is requesting a local government resolution in support of her application to the provincial Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) in order to amend the hours of liquor service at the Great Canadian Casino - Nanaimo, located at 620 Terminal Avenue (Attachment A) as follows:

The applicant recently received approvals from the British Columbia Lottery Corporation to adjust the hours of operation. The Great Canadian Casino – Nanaimo is currently undergoing renovations to relocate and expand restaurant seating, and to increase the number of gaming devices. As a result, the applicant would like to adjust the liquor services hours to better serve patrons during hours of gaming operations (Attachment B).

Hours of service and capacity are subject to local government consideration and comment. A municipal resolution is required before the province will consider the application further.



DISCUSSION

As part of the liquor primary licence amendment review process, LCLB asks the local government to comment on potential for noise, impact on the community and views of residents/neighbouring businesses. The local government is also asked to offer comment from a building and fire perspective.

• The potential for noise if the application is approved

The subject property is located downtown and is included within the DT6 - Port Place Zone; casino, neighbourhood pub, lounge and entertainment uses (includes nightclubs) are all permitted uses within this zone. As nightclubs, neighbourhood pubs and other late night entertainment uses are permitted within the downtown core; expected noise levels in this area are much higher than those in the rest of the city. As the casino is an existing facility and the application does not include any change to the casino's occupant load, Staff does not anticipate an increase in noise if the application is approved.

• The impact on the community if the application is approved

The Great Canadian Casino – Nanaimo received support for their original liquor licence application in September of 2010. At that time, the Casino entered into a Good Neighbour Agreement with the City of Nanaimo, became members in Nanaimo's Bar Watch community, registered a covenant restricting the use on the property to prevent a nightclub or stand-alone neighbourhood pub, and agreed to no liquor service be permitted within the outdoor patio area.

Police records indicate a large number of calls for service in the area around the Casino, but most are not related to the venue's operation of liquor service. The RCMP note that the venue is professionally managed, has well-trained security staff, and onsite surveillance measures. The RCMP does not object to the application and does not anticipate any adverse impact on police resources (Attachment D).

A negative community impact is not anticipated.

The views of residents / neighbouring businesses

A public notice and comment sheet has been mailed and hand delivered to the owners, residents, and business owners of buildings and properties within 100m of the subject property. A total of 102 comment sheets were mailed out and delivered. Of the 12 responses received, 8 are in support of the application and 4 are opposed. Only 1 letter included an opposition rationale explaining traffic and security in a closed mall setting as a concern. Comment sheets returned are included as Attachment C.

Through the application process, City Staff contacted the Downtown Nanaimo Business Improvement Association (DNBIA) regarding the request for extended hours. The DNBIA voted to dissolve the organization in March 2017; as such a referral response was not received.

Opt Out of Application Process

With respect to all food and liquor primary licence applications, it is worth noting that Council has the option to provide no comment. If Council chooses to opt out of the application process, Staff will inform the LCLB of Council's decision and no further action will be taken by Staff



regarding the application. If a local government chooses to opt out, the LCLB will start their own review process, which could considerably delay the application process. As such, Staff recommends that Council does not opt out of the application review process.

Next Steps

Should Council pass a resolution to support the application to extend the hours of service, Staff will forward the resolution to the LCLB. The final decision regarding the approval of this liquor primary licence amendment application will be made by the LCLB.

SUMMARY POINTS

- The applicant proposes to extend the hours of liquor service to 11 a.m. to 1:30 a.m., seven days a week.
- 12 public responses have been received; 8 in support and 4 in objection to the application.



ATTACHMENT A LOCATION PLAN





On behalf of Casino Nanaimo, please accept this as our Letter of Intent and Community Impact Statement. We are writing to advise that we have submitted a Permanent Change to a Liquor Licence application with the Liquor Control and Licensing Branch (LCLB) to request a revision to our liquor service hours. In accordance with the Liquor Branch and the City's requirements for Municipal Approval, we would like to submit the following information for consideration.

Casino Nanaimo is located at 620 Terminal Avenue and features 24,000 square feet of gaming space with 384 slot machines and 6 gaming tables, as well as a restaurant.

Casino Nanaimo has a liquor primary licence to allow service from the main service bar to the gaming floor. The Company views alcohol service as an added amenity to our gaming clientele and has many safeguards in place to ensure that this requested change will not have a negative impact to the community. Not only do we adhere to the LCLB standards and policies & procedures we currently have in place, but we must also follow the strict measures set by the British Columbia Lottery Corporation (BCLC). These measures include pricing alcohol in a manner that will discourage overconsumption, drinks presented in single servings, and drinks withheld from guests appearing to be intoxicated. As this is a casino environment, access will not available to minors. To ensure minors do not gain entry, and do not purchase alcohol on site, it is our policy to check two pieces of identification for any person who appears to be under the age of 25 at the casino entrance points, and at the F&B outlets. In addition, Security Personnel are stationed at all access points to ensure liquor will not go beyond the boundaries. All employees that work in Great Canadian Gaming Corporation (GCGC) facilities that provide liquor service in British Columbia are required to have their "Serving It Right" certification. These employees are required to comply with internal policies and procedures, as well as policies developed by BCLC.

The site is currently undergoing renovations and we are making changes to relocate and expand our restaurant seating area at Casino Nanaimo, and to increase the number of gaming devices in the facility. Below is a brief summary of the changes:

Level 1

- 1. The old restaurant seating area will be converted to a new high limit slots room
- 2. The current bar seating area will be decommissioned and converted to additional kitchen space
- 3. We will remove the partition between the gaming floor and the existing shell space. The shell space will become restaurant seating
- 4. We will convert part of the existing gaming floor to a bar and additional restaurant seating
- 5. Existing racebook area will be converted into a table games area
- 6. The existing slot floor layout will be changed to allow for better guest traffic flow and additional gaming devices

Level 2

1. The existing space will be converted into licensed poker/racebook area

There will be no change in occupant load, however, as you can see, there will be more of a focus on food and beverage, and gaming options.

Casino Nanaimo recently submitted a request to the British Columbia Lottery Corporation to revise our hours of operation, and the request was approved on February 1, 2017. As such, we wish to adjust our liquor service hours to 11:00am to 1:30am seven days a week.

We will be the adjusting hours of operation to the below, which has been approved by BCLC:

We are requesting to revise our liquor service hours to the following:

This change will result in liquor service being available to patrons for an additional hour and a half later Sunday through Thursday (the liquor service hours will not change from the current approved times on Friday and Saturday).

Potential Positive Impact to the Community

Employment for Locals

The extension of liquor service hours will provide additional hours for current Casino Nanaimo employees and potential additional employment for locals.

More Entertainment Options in Downtown Nanaimo

The extension of liquor service hours will provide more entertainment options for local residents and visitors/tourists to Downtown Nanaimo seven days per week.

Increase to Revenues for Local Vendors

The extension of liquor service hours will create additional spending for local vendor services and entertainment.

Financial Benefits to the Community

The Province shares gaming revenue with local governments that host casinos and community gaming centres in British Columbia. From 1999 until March 2015, the City of Nanaimo received over \$41 billion in gaming revenues, which funds municipal and charitable projects in the community. The extension of liquor service hours may result in more visitors to the site, which in turn may result in additional gaming revenues and economic benefits to the community.

Potential Negative Impact to the Community & Measures Taken to Reduce Impact

Noise in the Community

It is not expected that the extension to hours of liquor service will result in any additional noise to the community as any measurable increase in noise is not anticipated to emit from the building, and the site is located in a commercial area with limited residential housing.

Demands on the RCMP

According to the British Columbia Lottery Corporation's document "Backgrounder on Perceptions of Casinos and Crime" written in November 2016, "Casinos in B.C. have more security and surveillance than most banks or venues of a comparable size that attract large volumes of people." It is not expected that the extension to hours of liquor service will result in an increased amount of police resources being used as the site has its own Security Department. Pursuant to the Security Services Act and Regulations of British Columbia, our Gaming Security Officers are required to complete the Advanced Security Training courses through the Justice Institute of British Columbia.

Impact on Traffic

It is not anticipated that the extension to hours of liquor service will result in any additional traffic in the area, or have any effect on traffic flow. The site is situated in a high pedestrian and traffic area located near a commercial shopping centre and the Vancouver Island Convention Centre. There is easy access to the establishment from local roads and a highway. Because the establishment is already located in a high traffic area, it is not expected that there will be a further increase in traffic.

We are in receipt of your letter advising that the Great Canadian Gaming Corporation at 620 Terminal Avenue is requesting a local government resolution in support of an application to change their hours of liquor service. The existing hours of service are 11 am to 12 am Sunday to Thursday, and 11 am to 1:30 am Friday and Saturday. The proposed hours of service is 11 am to 1:30 am seven days a week.

The venue is a gaming facility with an existing licensed capacity of 805 persons situated between Port Place Mall and the Vancouver Island Conference Centre in the downtown district. The casino is a prominent hospitality destination. This application coincides with ongoing renovation and improvement to the venue.

Police records indicate a large number of calls for service in and around the Casino, but most incidents are not related to the venue's operation or liquor service. The Casino has participated in Nanaimo's bar watch program for many years. The venue is professionally managed with a well-trained security staff and state of the art surveillance technology. Their security presence provides strong oversight both inside, and in adjacent parking areas. They do not permit patrons in their premise that have been banned or excluded by other establishments participating in the Bar Watch program.

Calls for police service are typically high in this area of the city. Incidents of public intoxication and disturbances are not uncommon, but are not typically associated to liquor service at the Casino. The proposed changes to hours of liquor service are consistent to operating hours of other licensed venues in the downtown entertainment district. The Casino has a large patron capacity, but the emphasis of the venue is gaming and entertainment. They utilize responsible serving practices, have a significant security presence to manage any alcohol-related incidents, and work cooperatively with police.



In consideration of these factors, it is not anticipated that the proposed change of licensed hours will adversely impact police resources, levels of criminal activity or public disorder, or increase calls for service.
